Credit values are assigned to each subject. Each semester subject earns one credit. Credit values are multiplied times grade values. The total is divided by the possible credits to be earned to determine grade point average. Courses graded satisfactory/unsatisfactory are not included in the GPA. Dual enrollment/college courses are also not included in the GPA.

All Honors, Accelerated and AP courses achieving a grade of 77% and higher will receive the advantage of three percentage points allowing the highest grade to be 103%.
