Vocabulary

All the words in this lesson contain the suffixes -ible, -able, or -ile, meaning "able" or "worthy of being."

- accessible (ak SES uh buhl) ADJ. approachable (My favorite teachers were accessible and easy to talk to.)
- discernible (di SUR nuh buhl) ADJ. able to be seen or recognized (The cancer cells were barely discernible under the microscope.)
- **exceptionable** (ik SEP shuh nuh buhl) ADJ. likely to cause objection or exclusion (The network cancelled the show because it could be exceptionable for many viewers.)
- fallible (FAL uh buhl) ADJ, liable to make a mistake (He would not accept criticism because he thought he was not fallible.)
- illimitable (i LIM i tuh buhl) ADJ. boundless; not able to be limited (Some scientists say the universe is illimitable.)
- immeasurable (i MEZH ur uh buhl) ADJ. extensive: not able to be measured // have immeasurable faith in your ability to complete this task well.)
- indispensable (IN di SPEN suh buhl) ADJ. essential (Antibiotics are indispensable in treating bacterial infections.)
- indomitable (in DAHM i tuh buhl) ADJ. not able to be subdued; unconquerable (The indomitable spirit of the pioneers helped them survive the long journey west.)
- inevitable (in EV i tuh buhl) ADJ, not able to be prevented or avoided (The stock market crash was inevitable after so many investors sold out.)
- insufferable (in SUHF ur uh buhl) ADJ. not able to be endured (His vanity and his selfishness made him an insufferable person.)
- interminable (in TUR muh nuh buhl) ADJ. endless (When I had poison ivy, the itching seemed interminable.)

- intolerable (in TAHL ur uh buhl) ADJ. unendurable (The heat and humidity this summer have been intolerable.)
- irrevocable (i REV uh kuh buhl) ADJ. not able to be changed (Her thoughtless remarks caused irrevocable damage to their friendship.)
- mobile (MOH buhl) ADJ. able to move easily (Many people prefer to live in mobile homes.)
- ostensible (ah STEN suh buhl) ADJ. having the appearance of being open to view; apparent (The candidate's ostensible purpose was to help the homeless; his real goal was to win votes.)
- pliable (PLY uh buhl) ADJ. easy to bend or twist (Because gold is so pliable, it is easy to form it into various shapes for iewelry.)
- reparable (REP ur uh buhl) ADJ. able to be repaired (Luckily, the damage to my car was reparable.)
- tractable (TRAK tuh buhl) ADJ. easily controlled; docile (Once captured, the horse became quite tractable.)
- unconscionable (uhn KAHN shuh nuh buhl) ADJ. beyond reason; shockingly unjustifiable (Many antiwar protesters felt the Vietnam War was unconscionable.)
- venerable (VEN ur uh buhl) ADJ. deserving of respect, usually because of age (We make sure my venerable grandfather sits at the head of the table for family celebrations.)
