MTSS Information

September was a busy month with students settling into their new routines. The classroom teachers and MTSS (Multi-tiered Systems of Support) team were busy this month assessing students using DIBELS 8th Edition and I-Ready benchmarks in Reading and Acadience Learning and I-Ready in Math.

All students in Kindergarten through fifth grade will participate in our MTSS time. Our MTTS Reading time is called WIN. WIN stands for **What I Need**. During WIN time in each grade level, the MTSS team and the classroom teachers will address instruction in the regular education setting based on student needs. Students will be grouped based upon universal screening results.

Universal screening results will also be used to identify students who need additional support in math. These students will work with one of the MTSS teachers during assigned grade level times.

Students in Kindergarten through fifth grade who qualified for additional support in the areas of reading and math will be working with one of the MTSS teachers. Reading and Math support will tentatively begin mid-October. Classroom teachers will reach out to parents regarding student participation.



Maintaining a Health School Environment for All!

1. Please monitor your child for signs of illness, such as fever, cough, and stomachache. Please do not

send students to school if they are exhibiting signs of illness.

2. Encourage healthy hygiene habits at home to reinforce school expectations. Frequent hand washing,

covering of coughs and sneezes, and social distancing are all important in stopping the spread of illness.

3. Hydration supports the body's ability to fight off infection. Dehydration can be caused by fevers, salty

diets, and caffeine. Please have a water bottle for your student to sip throughout the day.

4. The weather is changing! Students go outside for recess every day unless it is raining. At this time of

year, there are also extra recesses. Please make sure your child is dressed appropriately for the weather.

Layering clothing is a good option when the mornings are cool but the afternoons are warm.

5. Any medication sent to school, prescription or over-the-counter, must be registered in the Nurses'

Office and must be accompanied by a medication authorization form and signed by a physician. To

request a form, contact the nurses or download it from the website.
